This course will have two distinct yet complementary days, providing insights from the front lines of different industries and offering the opportunity to explore economic aspects of patent and innovation practices.

This European Patent Academy event will be held in a superb Swiss Alpine setting close to Lake Constance (Bodensee). The welcome desk of the course will open on the afternoon of Sunday 3 September, and participants will be encouraged to make the most of the leisure opportunities that the scenic town of St.Gallen and the surrounding countryside have to offer during the weekend prior to the Summer Course.

Participants will enjoy the opportunity to discuss a wide variety of current IP-related topics with inter-industry IP experts, to exchange best practices as well as to network with fellow practitioners and researchers. The course addresses experts in IP, R&D and law from different industries as well as academics, explaining a range of current practical and scientific topics in IP (see call for abstracts). The working language of the Summer Course will be English.
